DeWitt County Protocols and Procedures due to COVID-19

Public Notice

For all DeWitt County offices, the following procedures are taking place:

- Avoiding close contact with people who are sick.
 - We are following the recommendations by the Department of State Health Services that you maintain at least 6-8 feet between you and a person who is symptomatic to reduce the risk of spread of the virus.
- Avoiding touching eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Staying home when sick.
- Covering cough or sneeze with a tissue (or into arm if a tissue is not available); then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched objects and surfaces using a household cleaning spray or wipe. A list of products recommended by DSHS for this purpose is available at https://www.americanchemistry.com/novel-coronavirus-fighting-products-list.pdf.
- Washing hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing nose, coughing, or sneezing.
 - o If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.

As of May 18, 2020, county offices are open to the public. Please be aware that access may be limited due to social distancing guidelines. Please refer to protocol of specific offices for more information.

- Sneeze guards have been installed at each clerk's window
- Our floors are measured & marked for safe social distancing (1 at each clerk window & 3 others in various spaces for a total of 7 in office). EFFECTIVE: May 18, 2020 until further notice –

- The DeWitt County Clerks' office will open to the public. The office will close at 4:45 p.m. each day to allow the staff time to disinfect the office.
- We will limit the number of customers in our office at any given time. We ask that only the necessary person(s) enter the office to conduct business. Due to this, you may be asked to wait outside and/or experience a wait time.
- Only one (1) customer will be allowed at each front counter at a time.
- There will be markers on the floor so that social distancing can be achieved between customers in the lobby area.
- Customers needing to perform research within the records will need to contact the office to schedule an appointment. Only three (3) customers will be allowed in the public computer room at a time.
- Customers <u>will not</u> be allowed near the employee's desk. All request <u>must</u> be presented at the front counter behind the protective sneeze guards.
- All necessary precautions will be taken to ensure the safety of the employees and customers as follows:
 - o Protective Sneeze Guards have been placed on each of the front counters for the safety of the customer and the employee.
 - o Individuals are encouraged to wear appropriate face coverings.
 - o Hand sanitizer will be available at the front counter.

- o Clorox wipes and/or Paper Towels with Disinfecting Spray will be available for disinfecting the public station computer keyboards.
- County Clerk's office staff will disinfect between customers and throughout the day.
- County Clerk's office asks that if you have any symptoms of, or been exposed to, COVID-19 or flu-like symptoms, or a fever, cough or sneezing, please <u>DO NOT</u> enter the office.

<u>DeWitt County Juvenile Probation – Terri Rogers</u>

Beginning June 1, 2020:

- -All employees will resume in office workdays.
- -All juveniles will start reporting to probation officers in person. Home visits and placement visits will also resume.
- -Regularly scheduled group and individual sessions will resume in person.
- -Employees are required to have child care lined up. Employee's children will no longer be allowed to come to work with the employee.
- -Employees who feel ill will not be allowed to come to work. Any employee with a fever will not come to work and will not be allowed to return until they are free of fever for 24 hours without medication.

- Voter Registration: If you would like to registrar to become a Registered Voter of
 De Witt County, you may stop by our office between 8am and 4pm or you may contact our office at 361-275-0859 and we would be happy to mail you a Voter Registration Card for you to fill out and mail back to our office.
- <u>Change of Address</u>: If you are a Registered Voter and need to change your address, you may stop
 by our office between the hours of 8am and 4pm or you may contact our office at 361-275-0859.
 We would be happy to mail you an Address Confirmation Card for you to fill out and mail back
 to our office.
- <u>All other Request</u>: If you need to request something from our office, for example list of registered voters. You may stop by our office between the hours of 8am and 4pm to fill out

required paperwork. You may also contact our office via phone or email and we will email you the required paperwork to request the information which you are requesting.

- <u>Social Distancing</u>: While in our office we ask that you follow the 6ft Social Distancing as marked on the floor.
- <u>Hand Sanitizer</u>: Hand Sanitizer will be available for you to use when you enter our office.
- <u>Cleaning of Voting Equipment</u>: All voting equipment will be kept clean per Hart Intercivic recommendations. Wipe polling place devices and booths with a lint-free cloth that has been slightly dampened with 50% or higher clear isopropyl alcohol (hand alcohol wipes are fine). It is best to do this every voter.
- Provide hand sanitizer at the voter check-in station.
- Use single use, disposable, ear cover for all devices.
- Additionally, poll workers and staff at poll book and workstations should keep their hands clean and equipment wiped down regularly.
- <u>Cleaning Surface of iPad:</u> Cleaning of iPads as recommended by Apple.

Unplug all cables and turn off the iPad.

Use a soft, slightly damp, lint-free cloth—for example, a lens cloth.

If material is still present, use a soft, lint-free cloth with warm soapy water.

Avoid getting moisture in openings.

Don't use cleaning products or compressed air.

The iPad has a fingerprint-resistant oleophobic---oil repellent—coating. Cleaning products and abrasive material will diminish the coating and might scratch the iPad. The use of isopropyl alcohol (IPA) is approved for use in cleaning systems in situations where the use of a damp, soft, lint-free cloth is insufficient. To do so, apply a small amount of isopropyl alcohol to a soft, lint-free cloth. **DO NOT APPLY THE ISOPROPYL ALCOHOL DIRECTLY TO THE SYSTEM.**

DeWitt County Sheriff - Carl Bowen

Sheriff's Order: March 13, 2020

In an effort to mitigate the impact of the COVID - 19 virus the following actions will be in effect immediately.

LEVEL I

Normal cleaning and hygiene efforts. Inmates are given standard materials as per normal protocol
to clean their pod areas. The operating areas of the jail are cleaned and maintained through
normal established procedure. Standardized intake procedures remain unchanged.

LEVEL II

Enhanced cleaning procedures to include sanitizing commonly touched areas as well as enhanced personal hygiene maintenance. Enhanced vigilance in viewing inmates during cell checks for any symptomatic indicators (i.e. flu-like symptoms), any inmate displaying flu-like or respiratory symptoms shall be immediately isolated until they are evaluated by medical personnel. Booking intake will include the recently issued COVID – 19 questionnaire provided by our contract medical provider.

LEVEL III

Active mitigating procedures are in place. In addition to the requirements of levels, I and II, inmates that present with flulike symptoms will be tested and isolated pending results. All additional duties of the work detail trustees will be suspended and will be reassigned to the deep cleaning of the DeWitt County Sheriff's office and County Courthouse. Personnel are required to use proper sanitation practices and report to their supervisor any instances of flulike symptoms. Cleaning operations are to be conducted 24 hours a day seven days a week while at this level. The jail administrator or his designee will provide a daily report to the Sheriff concerning the progress of the cleaning efforts, total number of inmates, inmates that become symptomatic, and any inmates that have been transferred during the last reporting period. Persons being booked into the DeWitt County jail will be screened in the sally port for temperature and no inmate or employee presenting with a fever of 101° or more will be admitted without medical clearance. Visitation will be suspended while at this level. Entry into the DeWitt County jail will be restricted to jail personnel, officers booking inmates and medical personnel. All administrative paperwork will be sent through the mailing tube if feasible; otherwise, oversized paperwork will be received by jail personnel at an approved entry point. Attorney visitation will continue to take place in the designated attorney visitation area, probation and/or parole officers may use the inmate visitation area to meet with inmates.

LEVEL IV

• In addition to levels I through III, the following procedures are implemented. The inmate population, with the exception of the trustees will be placed in lockdown. Persons that are charged with less than a class B misdemeanor will not be admitted into the jail. Supply trucks may enter the sally port and unload. After the supply truck has left, the jail trustees may then enter the sally port and dispense the supplies. All trustees are restricted to the confines of the

DeWitt County Jail. The recreational areas of the jail will be prepared to be used as infirmaries and or quarantine areas.

DeWitt County Justice of the Peace, Precinct 1 – Peggy Mayer

My office plans are to remain open Monday thru Thursday 8am to 5pm and Friday 8am to Noon. We will disinfect office each afternoon and prepare it for the next day's business.

DeWitt County Justice of the Peace, Precinct 2 – Blanca McBride

My office remains open its regular hours - Monday thru Friday 8 am to 4 pm.

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Office – DeWitt County – Anthony Netardus

The DeWitt County AgriLife Extension Office will be open to the public for office visits, effective 5/18/20. To minimize exposure and spread of the COVID-19 Virus, we will strongly encourage guests to come in for services by appointment visits. Walk-in customers will be accepted if all other guidelines are followed. Social distancing measures will be followed at all times and masks will be available for guests and office staff. AgriLife Extension clientele will continue to be encouraged to do as much business with the Extension office as possible via electronic media, i.e. text, email, phone calls, etc.

- Only 1 person will be allowed in the office at a time.
- Upon entering the County Annex Building, please use the hand sanitizer provided and take one mask if needed. Chairs have been separated and floor stickers are being utilized to comply with the 6 ft social distancing practices.

DeWitt County Adult Probation - 24th Judicial District – Jeff Pozzi

As of 5-11-2020, the Adult Probation Office has reopened to the public with normal business hours.

We are only allowing probationers in the waiting area and have posted signs indicating that no one other than the individual reporting is to enter the building. This decreases the foot traffic in the building. The waiting area has been set up so that social distancing is being practiced. There has been a table set up upon entering the annex that has a bottle of sanitizer and there is a sign on the table instructing those that enter the building to use the sanitizer upon entering and exiting the building. There are signs throughout the building that contain information about Covid-19 and how to recognize symptoms as well as how to minimize the risk of exposure. There is also information posted instructing those who feel ill to not enter the building and call the office.

All probationers are highly encouraged to wear face masks when reporting and all are being told to bring their own pen with them so that pens/pencils are not shared. Staff are wearing masks during office visits and when leaving their individual offices. Staff are not required to wear a mask when alone in their office. Each employee has a plexiglass divider on their desk to separate the employee and the person on the opposite side of the desk.

Chairs are being wiped down with disinfectant spray each time a probationer completes their office visit.

Cuero - DeWitt County Health Department – Lisa Campos

De Witt County Health Department will remain open to the public for nursing services, including vaccinations, TB testing and STD screenings. However in an effort to minimize exposure and spread of the COVID-19 Virus we will only be providing services by appointment visits only. Social distancing measures will be followed at all times and masks are strongly recommended.

Vaccine clinics will be conducted on Mondays 1pm-5pm, Wednesdays 3pm-5pm, and Fridays 9am-11am. Please call our office at 361-275-0920 to schedule your appointment. We will not open at our satellite clinic in Yoakum at the workforce center until further notice.

- Please call our office at 361-275-0920 to schedule your appointment.
- Do not make an appointment if you or child are experiencing any symptoms such as fever, cough, fatigue, shortness of breath or feeling sick, call back to schedule an appointment when you or your child are no longer experiencing these symptoms.
- Once scheduled, please arrive at your scheduled time, we will not take late appointments.
- Only 1 parent/guardian will be allowed with the patient.

• Upon entering the annex building, please use the hand sanitizer provided and take one mask if needed. Chairs have been separated and floor stickers are being utilized to comply with the 6 ft social distancing practices.
