## DeWitt County reports additional COVID-19 infections and recoveries


County officials are reporting changes since the December 21, 2020 update. There are **nine** (9) new cases to report. **Seven** (7) of the individuals live in the Cuero zip code. **Two** (2) live in the Yorktown zip code. **Forty-five** (45) previously diagnosed cases have recovered. As of today, there are **one hundred-one** (101) active cases. **Two** (2) of these patients are hospitalized. **Ninety-nine** (99) are recovering at home.

Although a total of **1,330** cases have been diagnosed in DeWitt County since Governor Greg Abbott declared a state of emergency on March 13, 2020, the active case count in the county may be higher due to the fact that not every infected person experiences symptoms or seeks treatment for COVID19.

Of this total, **twenty-nine** (29) are known to be duplicated entries. **Ten** (10) are known to be reported in the wrong county. This error typically occurs when test results are received from the Yoakum area and the patient's residence in is Lavaca County. Taking into account the above-referenced errors, the county believes the correct number of recoveries stands at **eleven hundred seventy-two** (1,172). The number of deaths reported to the state remains at **fifty-seven** (57).

Approximately **65 percent** of the **128,959** confirmed cases and approximately **62 percent** of the **2,337** deaths attributable to COVID-19 in DSHS Region 8 have occurred in Bexar County. There are approximately 3.1 million people in the 28 counties that make up Region 8. DSHS data is current through **December 22, 2020**.

In an effort to slow the spread of this infectious disease, Texas Governor Greg Abbott has issued Executive Orders during this period of emergency. Following the governor's order, Judge Fowler signed documents allowing bars and related establishments to open October 14, 2020. Rising hospitalization rates in Trauma Service Area S may result in the closing of bars, and restaurant serving capacity may be reduced from 75 to 50 percent under the governor's latest executive orders. DeWitt County does not meet the governor's criteria for a waiver of the requirement to wear a face mask in public when social distancing cannot be achieved. Before a county becomes eligible, the rolling 14-day case count must be under 30 new cases during the previous 14 days.
