Call to Order; Pledge of Allegiance & Invocation

Judge Fowler called the meeting to order and led everyone in the pledge of allegiance. Mr. Randle gave the invocation.

New Business:

Soil & Water Stewardship Week Proclamation (No. 1)

MOTION: Mr. Randle made a motion to adopt a proclamation establishing April 24, 2022 through May 1, 2022 as 2022 Soil & Water Stewardship Week. Mr. Afflerbach seconded the motion. Motion carried on a vote of 5-0.
