Judge Fowler reported that Koetter Fire will provide a quote for the fire suppression system at the new annex building.

Judge Fowler reported that the second emergency call was because that last Wednesday evening he went to the basement to check on things before leaving for the day. Judge Fowler discovered that the hot water loop had a zero PSI reading on the meters. He discovered a pool of water under one of the heaters.

Judge Fowler reported that the county courtroom is humid and the district clerk's office is warm this morning. Due to the internet being out, he is unable to check the computer downstairs to see what the problem is.

Judge Fowler reported that the inspection of the courthouse roof has been done. Some repairs were performed.

Historic county map mural is on the wall on the second floor of the DeWitt County annex building. Some of the county historic pictures have been placed in the glass. Court discussed items that still need to be corrected at the new annex building.

Judge Fowler gave an update on the Weber Annex Building roof work.
