Call to Order; Pledge of Allegiance & Invocation

Judge Fowler called the meeting to order and led everyone in the pledge of allegiance. Mr. Carson gave the invocation.

New Business:

Road Closure (No. 1)

Court heard announcement from Commissioner Varela on the need to close Mueller Road in Commissioner Precinct 1 for a bridge replacement and the publication of Notice to Close Road in local newspapers.

Lease Agreement (No. 2)

MOTION: Mr. Pilchiek made a motion for the approval of a one year lease agreement of \$1,650 per month between DeWitt County and 1884 Investments LLC for use of office space for the Justice of the Peace Pct. 2. Mr. Kaiser seconded the motion. Motion carried on a vote of 5-0.

Professional Services Agreement (No. 3)

MOTION: Mr. Kaiser made a motion to enter into an agreement between DeWitt County and H2O Partners Inc. for professional services involving the DeWitt County Hazard Mitigation Action Plan. Mr. Pilchiek seconded the motion. Motion carried on a vote of 5-0.
